Congratulations to everyone for your hard work!







James Winn, piano and composition professor at the University of Nevada, Reno since 1997, made his professional debut with the Denver Symphony at the age of 13 and has been performing widely in North America, Europe and Asia ever since. With his duo-piano partner, Cameron Grant, he was a recipient of the top prize given in the two-piano category of the 1980 Munich Competition (Musical America wrote about the team, "Not since Josef and Rosina Lhevinne regaled us in the 1930s have we heard such technical prowess paired with such genuine musical values").

Winn has been a solo pianist with the New York City Ballet, a member of the New York New Music Ensemble, of Hexagon (woodwind quintet plus piano) and the pianist and resident composer of the Telluride Chamber Music Festival, as well as a frequent guest with the Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center, Speculum, the Group for Contemporary Music, Cactus Pear Chamber Music Festival, La Musica International Chamber Music Festival and Bargemusic. Well-known as a specialist in new music, he has been involved in numerous world premieres and premiere recordings by many renowned composers, among them 13 Pulitzer Prize winners. He is currently a member of Argenta, the University of Nevada, Reno's resident piano trio, a founding member and regular participant in the Nevada Chamber Music Festival and performs regularly in recital with internationally acclaimed New York-based violinist Rolf Schulte. An active recording artist,

Winn has been featured in more than three dozen CDs as soloist, chamber musician and composer. He has received numerous career recognitions including an artist fellowship from the Nevada State Council of the Arts and the Governor's Award for Excellence in the Arts.

The Australian-American pianist Edward Neeman has performed across five continents. Critics have lauded him as a "true artist" with "an excellent technique" who "isn't afraid to put a distinctive stamp on whatever he touches, without resorting to mannerism." A top prizewinner of numerous international piano competitions, including first prize in the Joaquín Rodrigo Competition in Madrid, second prize in the Southern Highlands International Piano Competition, and third prize in the World International Piano Competition, Dr. Neeman has appeared as a soloist with the Prague Philharmonic, Sydney Symphony, Melbourne Symphony, Kentucky Symphony, Symphony of Northwest Arkansas, and the American West Symphony with conductors including Andrey Boreyko, Alan Buribayev, Chen Lin, Ruben Gimeno, Enrique Perez Mesa, Nicholas Milton, Pascual Osa, and Vladimir Verbitsky.

Dr. Neeman's debut album, *Rachmaninoff & Sitsky*, was released to wide acclaim in March 2016. The album includes a premiere recording of the Piano Sonata No. 1 by Larry Sitsky, written especially for him. Dr. Neeman also has released a live recording of the Concierto para piano by Joaquín Rodrigo on the Rodrigo Foundation label, andl as a collaborative CD with trumpeter Jason Dovel which was lauded for the players' "nuanced, stylistic interpretations and technical mastery" by ITG Journal. An enthusiastic collaborative artist, he has performed with musicians including Itamar Zorman, Abigail Fischer, Ben Capps, and members of the JACK quartet. Dr. Neeman has made numerous piano duet arrangements for the Neeman Piano Duo, in which he performs with his wife, the Indonesian pianist Stephanie Neeman. He also enjoys accompanying ballet and performed with the American Ballet Theater in their 2014 tour of Japan.

Dr. Neeman's published research includes his doctoral dissertation on free improvisation and graphic scores, an article on the chamber music of Larry Sitsky, published by ANU E Press, and pedagogical articles in STACCATO, an Indonesian music magazine. He has developed an innovation in the mechanism of the piano's sostenuto pedal that allows the sostenuto and damper pedals to be combined in new ways, and has given presentations on its ramifications for pedaling technique at the MTNA National Conference in the United States and the Australian National Academy of Music.

Dr. Neeman's interest in microtonal music has inspired him to transcribe quarter tone works by Charles Ives, Ivan Wyschnegradsky, and Alois Hába for MIDI keyboard. Originally written for a specially designed quarter tone piano, these works can now be performed by a single pianist as intended by the composers.

Dr. Neeman holds a Bachelor of Music degree from the Australian National University, a Master of Music from the Manhattan School of Music, and a Doctor of Musical Arts degree from The Juilliard School. His teachers have included James Tocco, Jerome Lowenthal, Solomon Mikowsky, Santiago Rodriguez, Larry Sitsky, and Irena Orlov.

Stephen Pierce enjoys a multi-faceted career as a teacher, performer, presenter, and scholar. He currently serves on the Keyboard Faculty at the University of Southern California Thornton School of Music where he oversees the secondary piano and pedagogy programs, and teaches piano major and minor students, as well as courses in piano pedagogy and

keyboard literature. Dr. Pierce previously taught at the University of Northern Colorado, Oberlin Conservatory, the Colorado International Piano Academy, and for the Los Angeles International Music Center. In addition, he teaches at Interlochen Arts Camp each summer, and works with students aged 7 and older in his private studio in Pasadena, California

Dr. Pierce holds degrees in Piano Performance from the University of Cincinnati College Conservatory of Music (CCM), and the University of Pretoria, South Africa, and two licentiates of music from the University of South Africa (UNISA). An accomplished performer, he has performed in the USA, Canada, Czech Republic, and throughout South Africa, with artists such as Carol Wincenc, and the flutists of the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra. During his studies in Cincinnati, Dr. Pierce performed with the CCM Philharmonia as a result of winning the CCM Piano Concerto Competition. In South Africa, he has performed with orchestras such as the Natal Philharmonic, the National Symphony, and the Chamber Orchestra of South Africa.

Dr. Pierce is a sought after adjudicator, has presented masterclasses and workshops across the US and South Africa, and given pedagogical presentations at state and national conferences such as the Music Teachers National Association (MTNA) National Conference, and the National Conference on Keyboard Pedagogy (NCKP). He has also served on the planning committees for both NCKP and the MTNA national conference and is currently CAPMT Vice President for Conferences. He is currently editor of *CAPMT Connect* and has published articles in journals such as *Clavier Companion*, *The South African Music Teacher*, *The California Music Teacher*, *Piano Pedagogy Forum*, and for the Royal Conservatory of Music (RCM). Dr. Pierce is also proud to serve as a RCM Academic Ambassador and member of the RCM College of Examiners.

### **Woodwind Adjudicators**

Dr. Brian Luce is the Professor of Flute at The University of Arizona and Yamaha Performing Artist. Dr. Luce has performed as principal flute of the Champaign-Urbana, Midland-Odessa, and Johnstown symphony orchestras and has performed with the Dallas Chamber Orchestra, Dallas Bach Society, Dallas Wind Symphony, Abilene Philharmonic, Keystone Wind Ensemble, and the Tucson Chamber Orchestra. As a soloist, he has performed throughout the U.S., Europe, Korea, Japan, and China. He has been featured at music festivals sponsored by the National Flute Association, British Flute Society, Shanghai International Exposition, Soka International Harp Festival, Texas Flute Society, Florida Flute Association, Mid-South Flute Society, Las Vegas Flute Club, Albuquerque Flute Association, Flute Society of St. Louis, Arizona Flute Society, and Tucson Flute Club. His performances have been broadcast throughout the U.S. and his recordings are recommended references by music education associations including the A.B.R.S.M.

Acclaimed as "an authoritative soloist," his Albany Records SACD, Music of the Superpowers: Sputnik, Spies, and the Space Race, has been lauded by The American Record Guide: "This release should be of particular interest for the less known, seldom recorded Denisov and Smirnova, though everything on it is enjoyable from beginning to end. Brian Luce plays with flair and intelligence..." He has also made the Premiere Recording of Anthony Plog's Concerto for Flute and Wind Ensemble with the University of ArizonaWind Ensemble. His release with Carrol McLaughlin, Allume, includes numerous premiere recordings of original works and transcriptions for flute and harp.

He has given recitals and master classes throughout the U.S., Europe, and Korea, Edition BIM and IntegrityInk publish his compositions, arrangements, and realizations. His performance and pedagogy articles have appeared in Flute Talk Magazine, and his dissertation, Light from Behind the Iron Curtain: Style and Structure in Edison Denisov's Quatre Pièces pour flûte et piano, earned the 2001 Morgan Outstanding Dissertation Award from the University of North Texas. Dr. Luce received his DMA and MM from University of North Texas and BME from Henderson State University.

He has previously taught at universities in Illinois, Texas, and Pennsylvania and tutored numerous young flutists across the nation. Brian is a prizewinner of the National Flute Association Young Artist Competition, Myrna Brown Young Artist Competition, Mid-South Young Artist Competition, Kingsville International Young Artist Competition, and University of North Texas Concerto Competition. His principal teachers include Mary Karen Clardy, Kathleen Chastain, Jacob Berg, and David Etienne.

As an Arizona native and avid outdoorsman, Brian enjoys trekking afield the beautiful alpine regions of the state with his family. He volunteers his time as a youth baseball and softball coach for Little League and serves as an executive board member.

Hailed as "one of the world's top saxophone artists" (Audiophile Audition) with "the personality and fingers of a first rate soloist" (American Record

Guide), "subtle, perceptive phrasing, and flawless control of vibrato" (Fanfare Magazine), Yamaha Artist Christopher Creviston has played venues ranging from Carnegie Hall to Paisley Park and the Apollo Theater. As soloist and with the Capitol Quartet, Creviston has been featured with bands and orchestras across the U.S. As a recitalist and clinician, he performs regularly with the Capitol Quartet, and in duos with pianist Hannah Gruber Creviston and guitarist Oren Fader. In addition to several established recordings with these ensembles, Crevistons most recent releases are the premiere recording of the Concerto for Soprano Saxophone and Band by William Bolcom with conductor Gary Hill and the Arizona State University Wind Orchestra, and a Creviston Duo CD called Breaking, presenting works commissioned (or co-commissioned) by the duo from composers Stacy Garrop, Mark Lanz Weiser, Katherine Hoover and John Fitz Rogers. Now on the faculty at Arizona State University, Professor Creviston has held positions at the Crane School of Music (SUNY Potsdam), the Greenwich House of Arts (NYC), the University of Windsor (Canada), and the University of Michigan. In January of 2017, Creviston became president-elect for the North American Saxophone Alliance. Dr. Creviston received his DMA and MM from University of Michigan and his BM from Michigan State University.

As a soloist, Julia Heinen has performed hundreds of concertos and recitals around the world including recent performances in Italy, Belgium, France, El Salvador, the Czech Republic, Spain and Portugal.

Ms. Heinen has adjudicated countless competitions including chairing the jury of the 9<sup>th</sup> International Mercadante Clarinet Competition in Noci, Italy and serving on the jury for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Biannual International European Clarinet Competition in Ghent, Belgium.

Julia Heinen is professor of music at California State University, Northridge. She served as the co-artistic director of ClarinetFest® 2011 and continues her work with this organization as the National State Chair Coordinator and state of California Chair of the International Clarinet Association. She holds degrees from the University of Michigan, Northwestern University and the University of Minnesota, studying clarinet with J. Cloyde Williams, Herbert Blayman, and Robert Marcellus. As a Buffet Crampon, D'Addario and Silverstein Performing Artist, Julia Heinen performs exclusively on Buffet Crampon Legende clarinets, D'Addario Evolution mouthpieces and reeds, and Silverstein HEXA ligatures.

Svend Rønning is Chair of the String Division at Pacific Lutheran University and where he is also Professor of Violin.

Dr. Rønning is a native of the Pacific Northwest and holds an undergraduate degree in violin performance, *summa cum laude*, from Pacific Lutheran University, which he earned in 1989. He subsequently earned Master of Music and Doctor of Musical Arts degrees from Yale University. His teachers include Syoko Aki, Sidney Harth, Jaap Schröder, and Ann Tremaine. He is of the most active violinists in the region, serving as Concertmaster of the Symphony Tacoma, violinist of the Regency String Quartet, violinist of the Puget Sound Consort as well as frequent soloist, recitalist, chamber musician and recording artist. Dr. Rønning is also Artistic Director of the Second City Chamber Series, Tacoma's award winning producer of chamber music concerts and chamber music educational programs. Svend Rønning has served as Concertmaster of various orchestras including the Charlottesville Symphony, the San Jose Symphony, the Spoleto U.S.A. Chamber Orchestra, and the Tacoma Opera Orchestra. As soloist, he has appeared with numerous orchestras, including the Arctic Chamber Orchestra, the Charlottesville Symphony, the Everett Symphony, the Prague Radio Symphony, Orchestra Seattle, the Symphony Tacoma, and the Tacoma Youth Symphony. His repertoire includes most of the standard violin concertos as well as concertos by Alban Berg, Erich Wolfgang Korngold, Jerry Kracht (written for him), Walter Ross (written for him) and Miklós Rózsa. Chamber music appearances include performances at the Pacific Music Festival in Sapporo, Japan, the Mostly Nordic Chamber Series in Seattle, the Washington State Governor's Mansion Chamber Series, the Methow Music Festival, and Chamber Concerts for the Eastern Music Festival in North Carolina, Wintergreen Music Festival in Virginia, the Second City Chamber Series, and the Leo Kestenberg Musikschule in Berlin.

Other notable appearances and residencies have taken place at the University of Alaska, Fairbanks, Duke University, Ithaca College, Luther College, St. John's University, the University of Colorado at Boulder, the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, the University of Puget Sound, and Yale's Merkin Hall concerts in New York City. During the 2018 -2019 academic year, he will teach a section of the PLU-IHON course, "The Arts in Society: In the Footsteps of the Red Violin" at the University of Oxford as part of PLU's International Honors curriculum.

As a teacher, Svend Rønning has served on the faculty of Pacific Lutheran University since 1999. Prior to this appointment, he served on the music faculty of the University of Virginia and has been pleased to train young musicians who have gone on to careers with significant orchestras including the Virginia Symphony, the Lexington Philharmonic, the Bellevue Philharmonic, and the Tacoma Symphony. Others enjoy careers in popular music, performing with a number of popular ensembles, among them the Seattle Rock Orchestra and the Dave Matthews Band. He has also been privileged to be part of the development of many fine music teachers who serve in public and private schools including the faculties of the Asbury College and Center Colleges in Kentucky as well as students who have distinguished themselves in public school districts throughout the country.
